An SPP is a contract that enables your state or local government to pay the laboratory to perform a defined scope of work with tasks that draw upon the unique facilities, equipment and personnel of the laboratory.

Cooperative Research and Development Agreement (CRADA)

A CRADA is a cost-shared research and development agreement that allows your state or local government to work collaboratively with Argonne, and, as appropriate, private industry participants to share technical expertise, develop novel technologies/solutions and access intellectual property emerging from the effort.
